	 Qatar – needs to be renamed due to rules within Qatar so request IDBF for assistance. Matt Smith asked for this to be submitted in a letter. 	
	 Egypt - passion to continue to see the development of dragon boating within the African continent. Need a lot of support from IDBF to make it happen. 	
	Matt Smith said that there was a lot that IDBF would like to develop in this region.
